

WHITE HILLS PRIMARY SCHOOL ENROLMENT POLICY

In conjunction with the Department of Education & Training Loddon Mallee Area Directorate and the White Hills Primary School Council, the Regional Director has determined an enrolment ceiling of 650 for White Hills Primary School, due to site and facility constraints.

- In managing new enrolments within this ceiling, the school is required to adhere to state wide enrolment placement policy, whereby eligible students have a right to be placed in their designated neighbourhood school.
- The designated neighbourhood school is defined as the school that is nearest to the student's permanent residential address, measured in a straight line from the residence.
- Students living outside the designated neighbourhood may still apply for enrolment, with remaining places to be allocated in the following order:
 1. Students for whom the school is the designated neighbourhood school.
 2. Students with a sibling at the same permanent address who are attending the school at the same time.
 3. Where the Regional Director has restricted the enrolment, students who reside nearest the school.
 4. Students seeking enrolment on specific curriculum grounds (this criteria generally does not apply to primary settings).
 5. All other students in order of closeness of their home to the school.
 6. In exceptional circumstances, compassionate grounds (to be determined by the Regional Director).
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A map of the School's Neighbourhood Zone is available for viewing on request from the school office.

The enrolment policy will be managed by the Principal and is reviewed every 2-3 years
