Children must be excluded from school until appropriate treatment has commenced and sores on exposed surfaces must be covered with a watertight dressing.

## Teach Your Child To Bounce Back From Life's Uncertainties. Part 4:

*A selection from an article by Alison Campbell Rate*

Here are some more ideas to get you started building resilience in your children.

### FIND OPTIMISTIC EXPLANATIONS

Mastery skills involve the way the child thinks, particularly when he has failed. The child questions, "Why did I fail?" or "Why did I succeed?" Optimistic explanations are the basis of seeing failures as challenges with associated activity and hope. Train your child to think of optimistic explanations for events. Watch the way you describe events-both for yourself and for your child: For example:

\*Do you tend to use terms like "always" and "never" when things go wrong... "You never tidy your toys" or do you focus on the actual event? "You forgot to tidy your toys. You'll have to finish before you watch TV."

\*Do you describe setbacks as permanent catastrophes... "I'm useless at cooking." or as incidents that can be acted upon? "This cake didn't turn out very well. I'll try a different recipe next time."

\*When things go well do you call them "flukes"... "You were lucky your teacher was in a good mood" or do you give your child the credit? "Your teacher gave you the job because you are reliable."

### Chinese Immersion Program 2017

Thanks to the three families who have expressed interest in hosting a Chinese student for the 8 weeks of the program. If your family might be interested in hosting a Chinese student in October this year please let me know. The students usually arrive in week 2 of Term 4 and leave in the first week of December. Bendigo Team China schools are endeavouring to collect information now to determine the number of Chinese students we are able to host.

I am seeking expressions of interest from families of children in Grades 3-6 (can be other grades also) to host a Chinese student for four or eight weeks during their visit. The Chinese students who visit are usually 10-11 years old and have just entered Grade 5 (Chinese school year begins in September). Last year we had four Chinese students and a teacher from our Sister School, Jinji Lakes PS in Suzhou Industrial Park.

WHY: To improve **fine motor skills** (small movements — such as picking up small objects and holding a spoon — that use the small muscles of the fingers, toes, wrists, lips, and tongue) and **gross motor skills** (bigger movements — such as rolling over and sitting — that use the large muscles in the arms, legs, torso, and feet) and **concentration skills**.
