During National Literacy & Numeracy Week from 25th – 29th August we will have a visiting performance from 'The Blurbs' on **Thursday, 28th August**. The Blurbs are a song and dance group that will be delivering a performance based upon five books we will be studying across the school for Literacy & Numeracy Week. The cost for this performance is \$9.00 per student if you have not previously paid for Special Events. Those families who have not pre-paid for Special Events have been sent a notice outlining the closing date for payment at 4.00pm on **Tuesday, 26th August**.

Building Works: Term 3 Holidays

Over the next school holidays we will begin the first stage of our landscaping works between the main building and Peter Davey Building. This will involve the construction of a covered walkway between the two buildings, a polycarb roof over the open paved area at the back entrance of the main building, and a portico roof over the middle entry of the Peter Davey Building to provide additional shelter. These structural works need to be completed before we can begin the landscaping works between the two buildings. Future landscaping works will include installing artificial turf, seating and shade trees in this area. The Prep sandpit, pathway and play areas will also be redeveloped. Our local fundraising over 2013/14 will go towards partially funding these improvements. If you would like to check out School Council's future plans, the school's Grounds Master Plan can be viewed on the school website. A display will also be set up in the entry foyer.

School Nurse Visit Postponed

Due to an injury, our School Nurse, Leona Evans, will not be visiting our school in August. We have been assured that our children will be visited by a school nurse as soon as one is available. Thank you to those parents who have returned their forms. These have been collected by the school nursing staff. If you have not returned your form please do so as soon as possible. If you have misplaced your form please see Mrs Freeman for another.

Borrowed Clothes

Several children have been changed into dry clothes after they have slipped over in the yard. We ask that these clothes are returned clean to the school as soon as possible as our stock of spare clothes is very low at the moment. If anyone has navy winter trackpants they no longer need we would appreciate them to increase our stock.

Setting Limits for Children

From an article from "Parenthood" by Robin Barker.

CONSEQUENCES:

Consequences for undesirable behaviour are a necessary part of limit setting and need to be consistent, immediate and appropriate. Misbehaviour can range from irritating to destructive and dangerous, so consequences must vary according to the level of the misbehaviour and the age and stage of development. **Reprimand:** Letting your child know with a few words and by the tone in your voice that his/her behaviour is unacceptable. **Ignoring or switching off:** Is effective for misbehaviour that isn't dangerous or destructive- the irritating, attention seeking, day-to-day stuff. **Time out:** Is the best strategy for serious misbehaviour. It's also useful for both parents and child when they need to separate and cool off. Time out removes children from any attention-positive or negative- for a short time. Toddlers and young children need to be taken to time out, while older children should take themselves. **Withdrawing privileges:** Limiting access to television, an early bedtime or missing an event are all examples of withdrawing privileges. The aim is to keep the removal short and fair. It's a big mistake to make threats you can't carry through with or threats that will have more serious consequences for you than your child, for example, "I'll tell Santa not to call here this year". ...*continued next week.*

2015 Preps Enrol Now

If you have a child in Prep in 2015 and have not yet completed your enrolment form, we ask that it be returned to the school office now. Parents or older siblings can pick up enrolment forms from the school office.

2015 Prep Transition

Prep teachers are visiting pre-schools to get to know the children enrolled at our school for 2015. If you have not yet completed your enrolment form, we ask that it be returned to the school office as soon as possible so that your child can be visited.

Hand Washing

With some of our children having colds at the moment we are encouraging all children to carefully wash their hands with soap and ask that you encourage them to do the same. The critical moments for hand washing with soap are after using the toilet and before handling food.

Hand washing is a cornerstone of public health. Hand washing with soap is amongst the most effective ways to prevent diarrheal diseases and pneumonia, which together are responsible for the majority of child illness and deaths. Hand washing can also prevent skin infections, eye infections, colds, flu and intestinal worms. Washing hands with water alone is significantly less effective than washing hands with soap. Proper hand washing requires soap and a small amount of water. Using soap works by breaking down the grease and dirt that carry most germs, facilitating the rubbing and friction that dislodge them and leaving hands smelling pleasant.

Lost Property

There is a large amount of lost property in the box located near the office. Most items are unnamed. Please make sure all items of clothing are clearly named, especially jackets, as the students tend to take them off whilst playing outside. If unnamed items are left in the lost property box for more than 4 weeks, they will be given to the sickbay or charity.

It's Not Okay to be Away

Children should attend school every day unless they are ill or have a valid reason for being away. For example, a child's birthday is not a reason for being away from school. Studies show that children with more than 20 days of absence in a school year are seriously at risk in their learning. They miss so much work and are not able to keep up with their peers!

If your child is absent for more than a day, please call the school and advise the classroom teacher of the reason. Our school's policy is for the classroom teacher to phone the parent after more than one day of unexplained absence. When your child returns to school, please send them with a signed written note, explaining the reason for the period of absence.
