Principal's News

Hi everyone,

We thought it might be a good idea to include a couple of volunteering activities each week in the newsletter. We hope it might inspire additional assistance from our large school community. Thank you to those who already contribute, your support and assistance is greatly appreciated!

Volunteering @ WHPS.

There are various volunteer tasks that you can involve yourself in at our school. If you ask one of our volunteers, you will find they get a lot of satisfaction providing part of their spare time in helping others. As well as satisfying, you also get to know more about the school and its community. When your children/grandchildren see you at the school helping out in some activity, it makes them feel proud too. Once per term we have **Head Lice Checks**, usually the 2nd Monday of each term straight after assembly. Each term a devoted group of volunteers run and organise this program. More helpers are needed to ensure this is completed as quickly as possible. We have a great bunch of ladies who are willing to train you up, so you know what to look for. If you're a bit squeamish, it is a fact lice don't have knees so they can't jump! Morning tea is provided in our break, and you can have a chat and a cuppa with us.

Uniform Shop is run by a small group of dedicated volunteers who require your help in serving customers in purchasing uniform items. In a cosy little room you will get to know the other volunteers that also are there and the various uniform items they sell. Shop open times are Tuesdays and Fridays from 3.30-4.00pm. Whilst you are helping out, your children can have some after school play time with the other students waiting for their parent/grandparent who is also helping out.

Kelly Sports lunchtime and after school programs

Kelly Sports are offering a lunchtime 'Street Dance' program (1.40-2.25pm on a Wednesday) aimed at all year levels and an after school program titled 'Multi Mega Sports' aimed at Grades P-4 where the children will sample 3-4 sports for the remainder of Term 1. The purpose of the Kelly Sports programs is to provide young children with the opportunity to become involved in sports in a controlled, fun environment with the convenience of the program running at the school.

School Council Ballot

As I outlined in last week's newsletter, due to more nominations than positions to be filled, there will be a ballot to elect school council representatives this year. Packs with details on how to cast your vote were sent home with every family yesterday. We have only included one ballot paper per household but additional ballot papers can be collected at the office. Please note the ballot ends next Tuesday 7th March. Thanks to those who have already cast their vote.

It is really pleasing to have had seven parents interested in being a parent representative on school council this year, however there are only six positions to be filled.

How to vote: You can cast your vote by placing a mark or tick next to the name/s of up to six candidates.

There are three ways to cast your vote:

1. **Post:** Place the completed ballot paper in the smaller blank envelope provided and place this envelope in the second bigger envelope. Print your name and address on the back of the bigger envelope and post the envelope C/O The Principal, White Hills Primary School, PO Box 6002, White Hills 3550 so as to reach me by 4.00 pm on Tuesday 7th March the day of the closure of the ballot; or
2. **Deliver,** or arrange delivery of, the completed ballot paper to the school office between the hours of 8.00 am and 4.00 pm on any school day up to and including Tuesday 7th March, and place the completed ballot paper in a blank envelope and place the blank envelope in the larger envelope provided with your name and address written on it and deliver the envelope to Trudy Bawden the person authorised to receive and register the votes; or
3. **Place** the completed ballot paper in a blank envelope in the ballot box provided and print your name and address in the register of voters (This is at the office)

Process for Late Arrival or Early Departure: It's a Safety Issue

If a student arrives late to school, or departs early (for a valid reason), they must be signed in or out by **an approved adult** at the school office in the Sign In/Out book. Parents must NOT collect a child directly from the school yard or classroom. **This is a parental duty of care and child safety issue.** A tear off slip from the Sign In/Out book must be provided to the class teacher for a late arrival or early departure. **Latecomers are NOT to go directly to their classroom.** Your support with this process is appreciated.

Crossing the Road: Children & Parents Use the Crossings

For your child's safety we ask that all children use the crossing at the back of the school (Bosquet St) and wait for the duty teacher to assist them across the road. Parents should come and collect their child and take them across the road but no child should cross the road without an adult. Similarly, we ask that at the front of the school (Plumridge St) **ALL CHILDREN and accompanying parents use the designated school crossing** to cross the road. **DO NOT CROSS AT THE BRIDGE** – this is not a controlled pedestrian crossing.

Giving Kids Freedom

A selection from *"Too Safe for Their Own Good"* by Professor Michael Ungar, Canada's Dalhousie University.

Times have changed and the planet feels like a far bigger and scarier place today than when we were growing up. Australia is fairly safe, yet our vigilance has gone way over the top because events that occur are reported constantly in the media. Today, few kids under 10 go alone to the playground. They're escorted to school and have so many supervised play dates and scheduled sports, their lives are dubbed a curriculum rather than a childhood. We vaccinate more, and sanitise their play spaces, says Professor Ungar. We plasticise every sharp edge and try to make sure the world is as safe as home and that our kids are "bubble-wrapped"- a term Ungar coined to describe the unsettling trend experts say is creating a generation of kids so overprotected, it's stunting their growth.

At some point we have to let children manage risks themselves. Deciding when and how much risk to allow your children to take can be tricky. The key is to start small and early. For pre-schoolers and young children, set safe within sight boundaries, teach your child about strangers and road safety, let your five year old cycle to the corner while you watch from a distance. "Ask yourself what you did as a child and be guided by that," says Ungar. Still uncertain your nine or 10 year old should go anywhere alone? Depending on where you live, parents can offer substitutes like taking your child into town on the bus with you at first, and then with a friend. Or walk them to school for a few weeks, before gradually letting them go further by themselves until they're on their own or with a friend.

Teens can take risks too, by taking responsibility for younger siblings, doing some family groceries, etc. Yet even the best raised kids sometimes lash out with tattoos, piercings and wild hair. Don't panic if this happens as it's normal for teens to experiment with independence. If you have a healthy relationship with your child and trust them to have listened to your lessons early in their lives, they're much more likely to turn out okay. Trust is important. Our children need to know we will always be there to support them.

Picking Up Children from School

Parents are reminded that children can only be picked up from school by the child's parents or one of the people listed as the emergency contact for the child on their enrolment form. If you wish another person to pick up your child the school/classroom teacher must be contacted, (a letter or phone call will be sufficient), informing us of who will be collecting your child to ensure their safety.

Assembly

Kids Helpline Sessions

Grade 4M and 4S took part in a Kids Helpline session on Monday afternoon. The session linked us to a counsellor to chat about emotions, especially worry, and how we can deal with them. The students were asked to think about things that worried them, what happens to their body and how we can deal with our worry.

The big message the kids took away was feelings and emotions are not good or bad but rather some are helpful and some are unhelpful emotions. Finding out why we have these unhelpful feelings like anger, makes it easier to deal with them before we lash out and become physical or verbally abuse someone.

We think linking with these kind of organisations is really important to help with student's wellbeing and mental health. If you have any further questions about what was talked about in these sessions, please don't hesitate to contact your child's classroom teacher.
