### Parents and Friends Twilight Picnic

### Communication with Staff at WHPS

We take great pride in providing accessible communication methods between parents and staff. We will continue to use staff work emails and Compass email as communication tools between home and school. We have policies to support our communication processes and they can be found on the school's website at www.whitehillsps.vic.edu.au. We strongly encourage all families to read these documents so that everyone understands how we expect these communication options to be used. The key message that we want all families to understand is that both Compass emails and staff email addresses are <u>not</u> instant messaging options. Our teachers are busy teaching during class time and will not be checking their emails during this time. If you need to contact the school or your child's teacher about urgent matters, please phone the school on 54430799.

### **Crossing Safety**

We would like to remind all parents, carers, and guardians about the safety of our students when dropping off and picking up from school. Surrounding streets enforce the reduced speed zones of 40km, to improve the safety of students. At each pedestrian crossing, you must stop for anyone who is waiting to cross or who have started crossing. You must remain stopped until the crossing is clear. These rules apply even if there is no crossing supervisor. Out the front of the school is a 2-minute **Drop Off Only Zone** 

### Staff Car Park Safety

It appears that we need to again remind families that the car park at the front of the school (Plumridge Street) is for staff only (and visitors-Department staff, instrumental teachers, delivery drivers etc.). This is not a parking area for parents to either drop off or pick up their children. With student movement through this area in the morning and after school we do not want cars moving in and out of this space at these critical times. Your support and willingness to follow these guidelines is greatly appreciated.

### Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF) applications

The CSEF helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you have a valid meanstested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seekers and refugee families. Payment amounts this year are \$150 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child. If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 54430799 and ask for an application form. You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page. Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office by the end of the Term 2.

### Process for Late Arrival or Early Departure

If a student arrives late to school, or departs early (for a valid reason), they must be signed in or out by an approved adult at the school office. Parents must NOT collect a child directly from the school yard or classroom. This is a parental duty of care and child safety issue. A tear off slip from the sign in computer must be provided to the class teacher for a late arrival or early departure. Latecomers are NOT to go directly to their classroom. Your support with this process is appreciated.

### Supervision responsibilities before and after school

At White Hills Primary School, the school grounds are supervised by staff from 8.40am before school and until 3.40pm after school. There may be staff in attendance at the school before and after those times, but those staff may be involved in tasks such as meetings or lesson preparation. This means that these staff members will not be supervising students. I know that a number of parents accompany their children to school and wait to see that they are settled. This practice is fine, and is certainly encouraged, as parents are supervising their own children. Formal before and after school care is available within the school grounds and is operated by OSH Club.


